Piaget's social development theory. Jean Piaget (1896-1980) was a biologist who originally studied molluscs (publishing twenty scientific papers on them by the time he was 21) but moved into the study of the development of children's understanding, through observing them and talking and listening to them while they worked on exercises he set.

The main educational implications of Piaget's theory are the following: 1. A focus on the process of thinking and learning, not just its final products.

### Educational implications and activities of Piaget's theory

Piaget also believed there were four distinct phases of development. How he termed them as follows, along with an outline of some of the key characteristics of each. Stage One: Piaget called this the Sensorimotor Stage which is believed to span from birth to approximately 2 years old. It is characterized by a half a dozen sub stages.

Piaget says that children obtain knowledge or their environment through the five senses. Vygotsky's Zone of Proximal Development (ZPD) is similar to Montessori's Planes of Development and Piaget gives each developmental stage a name (sensorimotor, preoperational, formal operations).

Piaget thought that interaction with peers encouraged disequilibrium or cognitive conflict forcing change or "development." Vygotsky theorized that language was the most important tool for development. Piaget, however, didn't think that language played a huge role.

Piaget's clear distinctive idea (both from Vygotsky and bandura): "[Peer interaction is] both qualitatively different from and superior to adult-child interaction in facillitating cognitive growth. Under conditions of unequal power, a child may well accept the adult's view but is unlikely to undergo the cognitive restructuring necessary ...
